- Ann and George don't do their homework in the afternoon. (gör inte)
- Everyone needs love and affection. (behöver)
- Julian's youngest son doesn't understand mathematics. (förstår inte)
- I believe that miracles still occur. (händer, förekommer)
- The Browns don't accept animal abuse. (accepterar inte)
- Alan doesn't speak German. (talar inte)
- His wife Helen, on the other hand, speaks excellent German. (talar)
- Do their children speak many languages? (Talar deras barn)
- Cows normally drink a lot of water, several litres a day. (dricker)
- A newborn baby sleeps almost twenty hours a day. (sover)
- A hungry baby doesn't sleep very well. (sover inte)
- Does your husband iron his shirts? (Stryker din man)
No, he doesn't. (Nej, det gör han inte.)
- Do your dogs obey orders? (Lyder era hundar)
- Nobody wants to clean the house and do the laundry. (vill)
- Most students have part time jobs and earn some money.
(har...förtjänar)

Present tense = PRESENS

- Did you see anyone at the airport? (Såg du)
- No, I didn't. (Nej, det gjorde jag inte.)
- Mary didn't know that her twin brother was alive. (visste inte)
- The only thing she knew was that he had been kidnapped ten years ago. (visste)
- The Robinsons decided to go abroad for a year. (beslöt)
- They didn't want to go to Brazil, so they went to Colombia instead.
(ville inte...for)
- Did you help Bob with his homework? (Hjälpte du Bob)
- Yes, I did. (Ja, det gjorde jag.)
- We didn't write to aunt Claudia, we only wrote to uncle Hamish. (skrev inte ... skrev)
- My cousins didn't laugh, they didn't understand my joke.
(skrattade inte ... förstod inte)
- I poured some hot chocolate into a big cup and then I switched on the telly and watched one of my favourite programs. (hållde ... knäppte på ... tittade på)
- I didn't notice that someone had been in the house until later in the evening, when I saw footprints in the kitchen. (märkte inte ... såg)

Past tense = IMPERFECT

- Has anyone seen my sunglasses? (Har någon sett)
- How many English novels have you read? (har du läst)
- No one had noticed that the door wasn't locked. (hade märkt)

perfect tense

the pluperfect
